## Tea and Tomes:

All interested readers will gather in the Spartan Room of the Charlotte Community Library on April 26 to discuss *Remarkable Creatures* by Tracy Chevalier. The novel is based on the life of Mary Anning of Lyme Regis, England, who was perhaps the "greatest fossilist in the world." At a time when women were discounted in scientific pursuits, Mary discovered the first ichthyosaurus and plesiosaurus along with many other marine fossils. Not only was she shunned and abused by the scientific community, but by those who considered her class beneath them, and by the religious thinkers of her day. Desperately poor, she established a friendship with another female fossil-hunter and their relationship weathers storms of jealousy and rivalry. April Brooks will provide some geological background and describe some of the fossils mentioned in the book. If you have a fossil to share, bring it along to our meeting. We meet from 12:45-2:30 and tea and refreshments are provided.

### Lee Falik -

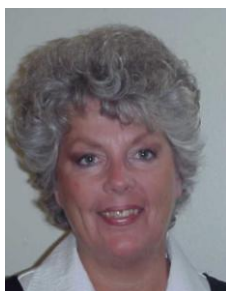

Hello GFWC members -

As you know, we wrapped up our own GFWC women's health passport program and many of us also participated in the 8-week Community Partners in Health Community Challenge (where Charlotte competed against many other communities in the area.)



If you have been to the Partners in Health (walking works) website, it sure looks like we came in 1st place. However, you will be reading in local papers that we came in 2nd. So I am writing to explain.

Technically, we had the most total miles and the most miles per participant. However, they disqualified some of our miles, because they had been logged more than two weeks after the date entered. The coordinators at the Community Challenge have a policy of disallowing too much "back dating" to keep any one team from entering all of their miles at once and shooting into first place at the end. (This policy was indicated at the beginning of the challenge.) So we were to log them along the way by certain deadlines. Apparently, some of the miles logged by individuals on certain teams - including our team - were entered too long after and were disqualified. It dropped us to 2nd place, based on miles we could count.

So, we really DID log the most miles - both total miles and per person miles. YEAAA Charlotte.

However, we had to come in 2nd because of this technicality. We did receive a check for \$2,000, which will be given to Charlotte Step by Step, to be used toward the creation of a master plan to enhance walkability.

We can all be very proud of our community and the way people have stepped up and increased their physical activity. Next year, we'll have another opportunity to come in first!
